# Things To Be Prepared for the Bris

- 25 3" x 3" gauze pads
- Bacitracin
- A&D ointment
- Baby wipes and 4 diapers
- Pacifier and bottle
- Firm sleeping pillow
- 2 cloth diapers (or towels)
- 2 Tallis (prayer shawls) optional
- Kosher sweet wine

## Day of Bris - Prior to Bris

- Do not soak or use ointments, creams or lotions on bris area; sponge bath is o.k.
- Dress baby in clothing which can be opened from the bottom and wrap baby in receiving blanket

## Day of Bris – After Bris

- Apply antibiotic ointment on gauze and place on top of area at each diaper change
- Baby may lay in any position that seems comfortable (even on stomach)
- If baby is uncomfortable, you may give 1/2-dropperful (.4 ml) of liquid infant Tylenol

## Day After the Bris

- Use antibiotic cream and ointment on gauze over entire bris area at each diaper change for the next 2-3 days.
- A soft, light-colored healing scab-tissue may form for several days. This is normal. Any redness will subside over a short period of time.

A bris milah, or ritual circumcision, is a wonderful beginning for a newborn boy. It is a memorable experience for the family, replete with significance and meaning. More than any other Jewish ritual, bris milah is an expression of Jewish identity. The bris is one of the most fundamental precepts of the Jewish religion.
